

- 1. Educational, to develop graduates' and society's understanding of hierarchical knowledge (Bernstein, 1979)
- 2. Occupational, to develop graduates' and production groups' collective productive capacity (Baker, 2009, 2011)
- 3. Social, to develop graduates' (Sen, 1999; Nussbaum, 2000) and society's capacity to understand and act in the world (Baker, 2009).
