3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

The holder of this certificate will have acquired the **general competence** to perform auxiliary maintenance operations on the electromechanical area, meeting technical specifications, safely and under the supervision of a senior technician. This general competence is divided into the following **skill units(UC)**:

- Perform basic machining operations (UC0620_1).
- Disassemble, assemble and replace simple mechanical parts of the vehicle (UC0623_1).
- Disassemble, assemble and replace simple electrical components of the vehicle (UC0624_1).

The professional skills are acquired through the **learning outcomes** defined within the related Training Modules (MF):

- Basic machining (MF0620_1).
- Basic techniques of vehicle mechanics (MF0623 1).
- Basic techniques of vehicle electricity (MF0624_1).
- Practical training at the workplace in auxiliary maintenance operations in vehicles electromechanics (MP0189).

As a reference, the learning outcomes include in the Practical training that complete and reinforce the learning outcomes acquired in the other training modules, are:

- Participate in the processes of customer service, accompanied by the manager.
- Participate in warehouse management, order parts and consumables.
- Participate in the working processes of the company, following the rules and instructions established at the workplace.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THIS CERTIFICATE

The holder of this certificate may work in the industrial sector, automotive subsector and specifically in the maintenance of vehicles, cars, motorcycles, commercial vehicles, agricultural machinery, public works, ships and railway rolling stock. The most relevant occupations and work positions are:

- Helper in the area of vehicle electromechanics.
- Assistant in the spare-parts warehouse.
- Fast mechanics workshop operator.

The holder of this professional certificate has recognition of the basic level training in labour risk prevention, according to Annex IV of the Royal Decree 39/1997 of 17 of January approving the Labour Risks Prevention Act.

5. OFFICIAL BASIS OF THE CERTIFICATE

Name and status of the national/regional authority providing accreditation/recognition of the certificate

The Ministry of Employment and Social Security or the corresponding autonomous regional administration within the scope of its competence, in the name of the King. The certificate is valid throughout Spain.

Level of the certificate

The Professional Certificate Level 1 of the National Repertoire of Professional Certificates corresponds to level 2 of the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED-P 2011).

The European Qualification Framework (EQF) level:

Grading scale/Pass requirements

The grading scale and pass level of the training modules are expressed on a scale of 0 to 10. The minimum score for a pass is 5 in every training module including a pass in the practical training at the workplace module.

The grading system is as follows:

- FAIL: 0 to 4.9

PASS-SATISFACTORY: 5 to 6.9

PASS-GOOD: 7 to 8.9PASS-EXCELLENT: 9 to 10

Access to next level of education/training

This Professional Certificate Level 1 gives access to Professional Certificate Level 2 within the same professional area and family.

For validation purposes, the educational authorities will recognise the professional module or modules of the VET diplomas corresponding to the skills units included in the training modules of this certificate.

Legal basis

Royal Decree 723/2011 of May 20th by which eleven professional certificates of the professional family Transport and Vehicle Maintenance, included in the National Repertoire of professional certificates are established (Appendix I, Code: TMVG0109).

6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE

This certificate may be acquired by:

- 1. Training: Completion with a pass grade of the face-to-face or online training programme.
- 2. Recognition of the professional skills acquired through professional experience or non-formal training (prior learning): Completion of a process of skills evaluation and accreditation in all the skills units making up the professional certificate.
- 3. Dual training: Completion of a training and apprenticeship contract, which may range from 1 year (or 6 months, if stipulated as such in the collective agreement) to 3 years, during which effective working time is combined with time dedicated to training under the training programme for the professional certificate.

The training method (number 1 above) requires successful completion of the training modules and the practical training at the workplace:

Entry/access requirements:

Additional information: Professional certificates are instruments for official accreditation of the professional qualifications in the National Catalogue of Professional Qualifications for all economic activities, within the scope of the labour administration. The National Repertoire of Professional Certificates is divided into three qualification levels (Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3), and by sectors into 26 professional families and 102 professional areas.
